A Message from the Dean



Congratulations, James David Christie!

Twenty-Five Years: Distinguished Artist in Residence and the Taylor & Boody organ celebrated 25th anniversaries on Sunday, March 21, 2010 at Saint Joseph Memorial Chapel, College of the Holy Cross.

This award-winning, 52-foot high, 10-ton instrument, designed in the tradition of 16th and 17th century Dutch and north German organs, was built in a two-year period by a team of craftsmen led by George K. Taylor and John Boody.

On the occasion of Johann Sebastian Bach's 300th birthday, March 21, 1985, James David Christie, world-renowned organist and Holy Cross Distinguished Artist in Residence, performed the inaugural recital on the newly dedicated Taylor & Body organ.

For Bach's 325th birthday, Professor Christie paid him homage again with a program of the composer's works, including his famous Toccata and Fugue in D Minor. The occasion also served as an opportunity to celebrate Prof. Christie's quarter-century of service to the campus of the Holy Cross College as resident organist and teacher. Annual Meeting of the Worcester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. This brief meeting will convene in the lower chapel of the St. Joseph Memorial Chapel at The College of the Holy Cross just prior to the Philippe Lefebvre concert described below. The agenda is a treasurer, membership and publicity report and also the introduction of the slate of officers for election for the 2010 -2012 term. April 25, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. – CHAPTER EVENT!

The Worcester Chapter AGO and the College of the Holy Cross will co sponsor an organ recital by Philippe Lefebvre at the St. Joseph Memorial Chapel at The College of the Holy Cross. Mr. Lefebvre will perform works of Bach, including his own transcription of Bach's most bravura work, the Chromatic Fantasia and Fugue, and Mendelssohn, interspersed with three improvisations in different styles. Mr. Lefebvre is internationally regarded as the finest improviser in France. He was the first place prize winner on organ improvisation competitions in Chartres and Lyon, and he serves today as organist at Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris.
